Bond of the goods of Frances Mabbett Widow Formerly of Landford and late of Whiteparish Intestate Deceased.

Granted and committed unto Lucy the Wife of Henry Hatchett one of the lawfull Daughters and one of the next of kin of the said deceased

Know all Men by these Presents that We Henry Hatchett of Badaley in the county of Southampton Laborer, John Gerrett of Whiteparish in the county of Wilts Laborer and George Jukes of Landford in the said County Blacksmith are held and fimly bound unto the Reverend and Worshipful Charles Daubery Clerk Bachelor of Laws Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Sarum in the sum of Two Hundred and Ten pounds of good and lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid unto the said Archdeacon of Sarum or to his certain Attorney his Executors Administrators or Assigns To which Payment well and truly to be made We oblige ourselves and each of us by himself severally for the whole our and each of our Heirs Executors and Administrators firmly by these Presents Sealed with our Seals dated the Twenty first day of February in the Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the fourth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith And in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty five.

The Condition of this Obligation is such That if Lucy the Wife of Henry Hatchett one of the lawfull Daughters and one of the next of Kin and Administrix of all and singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of Frances Mabbett late of the parish of Whiteparish aforesaid Widow Intestate deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands Possession or Knowledge of her the said Lucy Wife of the said Henry Hatchett or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Archdeacon of Sarum (if required) at or before the last day of May next ensuing and the same Goods Chattles and Credits and all other Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased at the time of her death which at any time after shall come to the hand or Possession of the said Lucy the Wife of Henry Hatchett or into the hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for her do well and truly Administer according to Law And further do make or cause to be made a true and just Accompt of her said Administration at or before the last day of February 1826 (if req) and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods Chattles and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration Accompt the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said Court shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of a late Act of Parliament made in the two and twentieth and three and twentieth years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second intituted an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall limit and appoint And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the

said Court making Request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the said Lucy the Wife of the said Henry Hatchett above bounden being thereunto required do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration Approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the said Court then this Obligation to be void or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
