

This is the last Will and Testament of me George Jukes the elder, Blacksmith, of near the parish of Landford in the County of Wilts.

I give and bequeath my Workshop Trade and Stock in Trade equally between my sons John and George Jukes on the condition that my said sons John and George do pay to their Mother Susannah Jukes the sum of one shilling per week each for the term of her natural life.

I give and bequeath to my Wife Susannah Jukes my House, Outbuildings and Garden, Stock household goods and furniture together with the interest of all sums of money I may have remaining in the Bank at my decease to her during the term of her natural life and at her death I will the said House outbuildings and garden be valued to my sons John and George Jukes and a full and equal share of the same to be given to my daughter Fanny Wolfe and to my daughter Jane Thornton each share and share alike with their brothers John and George; and further whatever property may be remaining at the death of my beloved wife whether in Stock, Goods or Money I will the same to be equally divided between my sons John and George Jukes and my Daughters Fanny Wolfe and Jane Thornton and if either of my aforesaid Sons or Daughters die before their aforesaid Mother their full share to be given to their family and in order that this my last Will and Testament be carried into full effect hereby nominate and appoint my Son John Jukes, Blacksmith in the county of Wilts and my son in law John Wolfe victualler, of Romsey in the county of Hampshire as my Executors to the same, and do hereby entrust them with all my Bonds, Deeds, money and security for money to enable them to carry the same into my full desire and request.

And now being in perfect health and sound mind I do revoke all former Wills by me made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament to which I have set my hand and seal this Ninth day of December One thousand eight hundred and thirty two
