.... His Will was committed unto

James Grayer one of the joint Executors named therein the like power being reserved to George Jukes the other Executor also named therein.....

This Is my Last will and Testement of John Jukes Blacksmith in the parish of whiteparish in the County of Wiltshire and desire to be Received by such persons as under mentioned, that is Mary Jukes my beloved wife to have the Interest of the money In the Salisbury Saving Bank to support her and her son George Jukes and when George Jukes the son of John and mary Jukes is 14 years old Then 15 pounds to be taken from the princable money in the Saving Bank to apprentice the said George Jukes son of John and Mary Jukes to a Trade which He may Choose for Himself for 7 years and after the death of Mary Jukes my beloved wife then George Jukes the son of John and Mary Jukes to have the Money Goods and House But if Mary Jukes My beloved wife should be married a gain or alter Her name then George Jukes the son of John and mary Jukes when he is 21 years old to Have Half the money and Goods and Chatels and House.
